- Interest in the housing sector and/or awareness of issues around housing and homelessness

Terms and conditions

The placement will take place at Shelter's Sheffield office at Furnival House, for 35 hours a week over a period of 6 weeks between the middle of June and end of September. The successful candidate will be awarded a £1,953 bursary by SMI.

Students who will be awarded the placement are expected to write two blog posts (x 300 words) for SMI about their experiences.
