Post Election Spending Cuts


- FY 15-16 In-year cut to overall BIS Budget of £450 announced

Spending Review – some big issues that might emerge


- Sale of Loan Book

- Raising cap on fees




18 year olds in England - ONS Mid Year Population Estimates aged to 18 year olds



18 year olds in England and the EU - Eurostat population statistics on January 1 by age and sex, aged to 18 year olds




UK and other EU full-time undergraduate entrants, 2002-03 to 2014-15



Young participation in higher education: English 18 year olds




UK and other EU entrants to full-time undergraduate study, by institutional groupings





International full-time undergraduate entrants, 2005-06 to 2014-15





UK and other EU part-time undergraduate entrants by level of study, headcounts 2005-06 to 2013-14





UK and other EU postgraduate taught entrants by mode of study, 2002-03 to 2014-15






Postgraduate research entrants by domicile and mode of study, 2005-06 to 2013-14














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HE provision in England Entrants to HE as proportion of 10-14 year olds in 2011




Young participation in higher education: differences and gaps

- English 18 year-olds from disadvantaged areas 11 per cent more likely to be accepted for entry to UK HE in the 2014 UCAS application cycle than they were in 2013
- Young HE participation rate for English 18 year-olds from most advantaged areas is
 60 per cent: significantly higher than the most disadvantaged at 20 per cent
- Disparities between areas remain even when prior attainment is taken into account




Young participation in higher education: by secondary school area






Young participation in higher education: by sex


Relationship between A-level achievement and young participation in HE for male and female pupils achieving at least three A-level grades between 2005-06 and 2010-11




Student retention and success: non-continuation by sex




HE provision heat map: Engineering and Technology




Graduate mobility: Engineering and Technology



Higher education and local growth: graduates in England vs unemployment in England





National Student Survey: trends in overall satisfaction




National Student Survey: unexplained differences in satisfaction




Intentions after graduation survey: Proportion of students who intended to study at postgraduate level in 2013, and the proportion who actually did




Progression from degree to postgraduate: one year transitions

UK and other EU entrants to undergraduate modern foreign language courses registered at English HEIs, 2005-06 to 2012-13













Provision of STEM subjects in England for entrants 2012-13




Employment location of graduates in England by industry type and study region




Graduate mobility between home, study and employment by subject
