- ▶ time management, planning and organisation

As a psychology graduate from the University of Sheffield you'll have lots of options open to you.

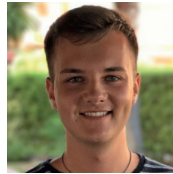

Where could your degree take you?



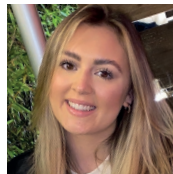
Amber-Sophie Dugdale

Professional Psychologist route

Our courses are accredited by the British Psychological Society, which makes them the first step towards further training to become a professional Chartered Psychologist. After further study, many of our students go on to work as Occupational, Educational, Clinical, Forensic, Health and Counselling Psychologists.

Applying psychology

There are lots of opportunities to work within psychology, applying your theoretical knowledge and helping clients through different forms of therapy. Our graduates work in schools with children who have specific needs, hospitals, for charities, and local psychology services in roles including Counsellor, Psychotherapist, and Psychological Wellbeing Practitioner (PWP) trainee positions.

Beyond psychology

Sheffield is a World Top 100 University, and a good degree from a great university can take you far, whatever you want to do. We have graduates putting their knowledge of human behaviour to good use in marketing and communications, human resources, data science, management and teaching.

Further study

If you're interested in postgraduate study, we'll help you to consider your options so you can specialise in an area of psychology you're fascinated by, learn new skills, or change direction. Some of our graduates choose to progress onto a PhD with the goal of becoming a researcher, others begin postgraduate training in areas such as neuroscience, mental health or child development.

Work placements

A placement is a great opportunity to test out a career path that you're considering – whether that's within the field of psychology or applying your transferable skills in industry. It'll give you experience of applying for jobs as well as interview practice, and will make you stand out once you graduate. You can do this as a recognised part of your degree with our BSc Psychology with Placement Year course.

Our students have previously completed their placements with organisations including the NHS, Prison and Probation Services and IBM.

Research placements

If you're considering a research career, a great way to get additional experience is to join the Sheffield Undergraduate Research Experience scheme. This gives you a bursary to spend six weeks working with one of our world-class research groups over the summer break. You'll be able to get first-hand experience designing and carrying out research projects, and time to work out if a career in research is right for you.

Study abroad

Spending time studying abroad is a great way to develop transferable skills. Our courses offer international opportunities, from extending your course and spending a full year studying abroad at another institution, to attending an international summer school on a topic of your choice.

Employers are quick to recognise the personal growth that students go through when they study abroad, and that graduates who took this option can offer a fresh perspective.

Jobs and volunteering



Luke was a Sheffield Science and Engineering Champion alongside his studies, running workshops and activities for primary school children.

Outside of your studies, there are clubs and societies you can join, committee and student rep roles you can go up for, and lots of opportunities to volunteer with local organisations and gain extra skills and experience. Sheffield has plenty of part-time work opportunities too. It all adds to your CV.

Many psychology students choose to work with us to develop their science communication skills, by running science sessions for local school children and events for the public. It's a great way to build your confidence and make new connections.
