EAS118	Chinese for Non-Specialists I	Autumn Semester	10 credits	Chinese	UG only	This module aims to enable students with no prior knowledge of Mandarin Chinese to acquire basic practical language skills. With an emphasis on communicative abilities, all four language skills – listening, reading, speaking and writing – are developed through classroom practice and self-directed learning.
EAS119	Chinese for Non-Specialists II	Spring Semester	10 credits	Chinese	UG only	This module builds on EAS118 Chinese for Non-Specialists 1 and aims to develop basic practical language skills in Mandarin Chinese. With an emphasis on communicative abilities, all four language skills – listening, reading, speaking and writing – are developed through classroom practice and self-directed learning.
EAS216	Chinese for Non-Specialists III	Autumn Semester	10 credits	Chinese	UG only	This module builds on EAS119 Chinese for Non-Specialists 2 and aims to enable students with beginners' level Mandarin Chinese (ca. 500 Chinese characters) to acquire increasingly complex practical language skills. With an emphasis on communicative abilities, all four language skills – listening, reading, speaking and writing are developed through practice and situational Chinese.
EAS217	Chinese for Non-Specialists IV	Spring Semester	10 credits	Chinese	UG only	This module builds on EAS216 Chinese for Non-Specialists 3 and aims to enable students with beginners' level Mandarin Chinese (ca. 700 Chinese characters) to acquire increasingly complex practical language skills. With an emphasis on communicative abilities, all four language skills – listening, reading, speaking and writing are developed through practice and situational Chinese.
EAS6271	Chinese Language 1 - Equivalent to EAS118	Autumn Semester	15 credits	Chinese	TPG only	This module aims to enable students with no prior knowledge of Mandarin Chinese to acquire basic practical language skills. With an emphasis on communicative abilities, all four language skills – listening, reading, speaking and writing – are developed through classroom practice and self-directed learning.
EAS6272	Chinese Language 2 - Equivalent to EAS119	Spring Semester	15 credits	Chinese	TPG only	This module builds on EAS6271 Chinese Language 1 and aims to develop basic practical language skills in Mandarin Chinese. With an emphasis on communicative abilities, all four language skills – listening, reading, speaking and writing are developed through practice and situational Chinese.

On successful completion of the module students will; have a vocabulary of about 300 words related to daily life, understand simple sentences and classroom expressions related to daily activities, be able to obtain specific information from written and audio materials, be able to hold simple conversations; and be able to write about the topics covered in class in simple sentences or forms.
EAS1082	Japanese for Non-Specialists 2	Spring Semester	10 credits	Japanese	UG only	This module aims to enable students with some elementary knowledge of Japanese to acquire further practical language skills, in listening, reading, speaking and writing. On successful completion of the module students will; have a further vocabulary of about 400 words related to daily life; understand and use the written forms of all the introduced core grammar patterns; and understand selected simple spoken and written structures and be able to use them as spoken and written communication.

EAS3082	Japanese for Non-Specialists 6	Spring Semester	10 credits	Japanese	UG only	The module follows on from and consolidates the skills acquired in Japanese for Non-Specialists 5 and aims to acquire further practical language skills, in listening, reading, speaking and writing. New grammatical patterns and a broader range of vocabulary and kanji are introduced and practised. Students will further develop their oral competence in spoken practice through role-plays and discussion activities, focusing on clear and appropriate communication.
EAS6122	Japanese Language I - Equivalent to EAS1081	Autumn Semester	15 credits	Japanese	TPG only	This module aims to enable students with no prior knowledge of Japanese to acquire basic practical language skills, in listening, reading, speaking and writing. Japanese scripts will be introduced at the start and used throughout. On successful completion of the module students will; have a vocabulary of about 300 words related to daily life, understand simple sentences and classroom expressions related to daily activities, be able to obtain specific information from written and audio materials, be able to hold simple conversations; and be able to write about the topics covered in class in simple sentences or forms.
EAS6123	Japanese Language II - Equivalent to EAS1082	Spring Semester	15 credits	Japanese	TPG only	This module builds on EAS6122, with an emphasis on learning more elementary knowledge of Japanese to acquire further practical language skills, in listening, reading, speaking and writing. On successful completion of the module students will; have a further vocabulary of about 400 words related to daily life; understand and use the written forms of all the introduced core grammar patterns; and understand selected simple spoken and written structures and be able to use them as spoken and written communication.

EAS6124	Japanese Language 3 - Equivalent to EAS2081	Autumn Semester	15 credits	Japanese	TPG only	The module follows on from and consolidates the skills acquired in EAS6122/6123. New grammatical patterns and a broader range of vocabulary and a further 111 kanji are introduced and practised. Students will further develop their oral competence in spoken practice through role-plays and discussion activities, focusing on clear and appropriate communication. Students will acquire the skills to read or extract information from unseen materials in reading comprehension class.
EAS6125	Japanese Language 4 - Equivalent to EAS2082	Spring Semester	15 credits	Japanese	TPG only	The module follows on from and consolidates the skills acquired in EAS6124. New grammatical patterns and a broader range of vocabulary and a further 122 kanji are introduced and practised. Students will further develop their oral competence in spoken practice through role-plays and discussion activities, focusing on clear and appropriate communication. Students will acquire the skills to read or extract information from unseen materials in reading comprehension class.
EAS6126	Japanese Language 5 - Equivalent to EAS3081	Autumn Semester	15 credits	Japanese	TPG only	The module follows on from and consolidates the skills acquired in EAS6125. New grammatical patterns and a broader range of vocabulary and a further 121 kanji are introduced and practised. Students will further develop their oral competence through role-plays in more practical and detailed situations and discussion activities, focusing on clear and appropriate communication.
EAS6127	Japanese Language 6 - Equivalent to EAS3082	Spring Semester	15 credits	Japanese	TPG only	The module consolidates the skills acquired up to EAS6126. It is aimed to train students to apply their knowledge in more practical and realistic situations. Further necessary grammatical constructions, a broader range of vocabulary and a further 120 kanji are introduced. The principles underlying the structure of kanji will be confirmed and students will practice how to use a kanji dictionary, thus enabling greater independent study. Students will further develop their oral competence through role playing, speeches, presentations and discussion activities, focusing on clear and appropriate communication.

EAS171	Korean for Non-Specialists 1	Autumn Semester	10 credits	Korean	UG only	This module aims to provide an introduction to the Korean Language for students with no previous knowledge. The emphasis is on achieving a basic level of communication in all four language skills; listening, speaking, reading and writing, which will lay the foundation for further study through classroom practice and self-directed learning. The module also aims to stimulate students' interest in Korea and Korean society by being aware of some of the major cultural and linguistic differences.
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EAS172	Korean for Non-Specialists 2	Spring Semester	10 credits	Korean	UG only	This module aims to allow students with some elementary knowledge of Korean to acquire further practical language skills, in listening, reading, speaking and writing. On successful completion of the module students will; have a vocabulary of about 400 words related to daily life, understand and use the written forms of all the introduced core grammar patterns; and understand selected simple spoken and written structures and be able to use them as spoken and written communication.
EAS21001	Korean for Non-Specialists 3	Autumn Semester	10 credits	Korean	UG only	This module aims to enable students to communicate in Korean with some prior knowledge and new knowledge of low-Intermediate grammar to acquire further practical language skills. This module will have an emphasis on communicative abilities, all four language skills – listening, reading, speaking and writing – are developed through classroom practice and self-directed learning. There will be a continued focus on developing students' awareness of the social and cultural characteristics of modern Korea and Korean culture through reading/writing/speaking/listening materials.
EAS21002	Korean for Non-Specialists 4	Spring Semester	10 credits	Korean	UG only	This module aims to enable students to communicate in Korean with some prior knowledge and new knowledge of high-Intermediate grammar to acquire further practical language skills. This module will have an emphasis on communicative abilities. All four language skills – listening, reading, speaking and writing – are developed through classroom practice and self-directed learning. There will be a continued focus on developing students' awareness of the social and cultural characteristics of modern Korea and Korean culture.
EAS373	Korean for Non-Specialists 5	Autumn Semester	10 credits	Korean	UG only	The module follows on from and consolidates the skills acquired in Korean for Non-Specialists 4 and aims to acquire further practical language skills, in listening, reading, speaking and writing. New grammatical patterns and a broader range of vocabulary are introduced and practiced. Students will further develop their oral competence in spoken practice through role-plays and discussion activities, focusing on clear and appropriate communication.
EAS374	Korean for Non-Specialists 6	Spring Semester	10 credits	Korean	UG only	The module follows on from and consolidates the skills acquired in Korean for Non-Specialists 5 and aims to acquire further practical language skills, in listening, reading, speaking and writing. New grammatical patterns and a broader range of vocabulary are introduced and practiced. Students will further develop their oral competence in spoken practice through role-plays and discussion activities, focusing on clear and appropriate communication.

The module also aims to stimulate students' interest in Korea and Korean society by being aware of some of the major cultural and linguistic differences.
EAS6261	Foundation in Korean Language 2 – Equivalent to EAS172	Spring Semester	15 credits	Korean	TPG only	This module aims to allow students with some elementary knowledge of Korean to acquire further practical language skills, in listening, reading, speaking and writing. On successful completion of the module students will; have a vocabulary of about 400 words related to daily life, understand and use the written forms of all the introduced core grammar patterns; and understand selected simple spoken and written structures and be able to use them as spoken and written communication.
EAS401	Foundation in Korean Language 3 – Equivalent to EAS21001	Autumn Semester	15 credits	Korean	TPG only	This module provides Intermediate training in spoken and written Korean, oral practice for various everyday situations and essential low-Intermediate grammatical structures. It also gives a general introduction Korean society and culture.
EAS402	Foundation in Korean Language 4 – Equivalent to EAS21002	Spring Semester	15 credits	Korean	TPG only	This module aims to further enhance students' communication skills in the four language skills - listening, speaking, reading and writing. Students are expected to communicate confidently in a wide range of social interactions including formal situations and simple professional contexts as well as reporting past events and sharing experiences.
EAS405	Foundation in Korean Language 5 – Equivalent to EAS373	Autumn Semester	15 credits	Korean	TPG only	The module follows on from and consolidates the skills acquired in Korean for Non-Specialists 4 and aims to acquire further practical language skills, in listening, reading, speaking and writing. New grammatical patterns and a broader range of vocabulary are introduced and practised. Students will further develop their oral competence in spoken practice through role-plays and discussion activities, focusing on clear and appropriate communication.
EAS406	Foundation in Korean Language 6 – Equivalent to EAS374	Spring Semester	15 credits	Korean	TPG only	The module follows on from and consolidates the skills acquired in Foundation in Korean Language 5 and aims to acquire further practical language skills, in listening, reading, speaking and writing. New grammatical patterns and a broader range of vocabulary are introduced and practised. Students will further develop their oral competence in spoken practice through role-plays and discussion activities, focusing on clear and appropriate communication.
