The Open Day is as flexible as you want it to be; you choose what to do and in which order, the only activities that are fixed are the subject talks. Use this guide to plan your day with us.


You don't need to sign in on the day – just head straight to your first session when you arrive.

Take a tour of Goodwin Sports Centre. Tours run throughout the day and last approx. 20 minutes. Meet at Goodwin Sports Centre reception.


