



## Pre-16 Sustained Outreach Programme - Discover US Guidance for Schools on the Application Process

### Introduction

Discover US is The University of Sheffield's sustained outreach programme for Y9 pupils who meet specific widening participation (WP) criteria from state schools within South Yorkshire and the surrounding region. Through repeated visits to the University in Years 9, 10 and 11, the programme is designed to raise participants' aspirations and their awareness of Higher Education. It aims to help these young people discover how university is within their grasp, and support them to make considered and informed choices. This document provides information about WP target groups and our selection criteria. It also explains the application process and what you will need to do to submit pupil applications on behalf of your school.

### Summary of Application Process

Pre Sept 2019	Your school should have already registered with our Outreach Online System and designated one member of staff as the Programme Contact for Discover US (please contact us with any queries relating to this).
Sept 2019	Programme Contact receives guidance document by email, and Parent/Carer letters and Discover US leaflets by post.
	Programme Contact selects up to 10 suitable pupils based on academic and widening participation criteria (see page 2), and provides them with a Discover US leaflet and Parent/Carer letter to take home. <b>You will need to add a suitable deadline date to the letters</b> for pupils to complete their online application – this deadline must allow the school time to then add the School Supporting Statement for each pupil by 18th October.
	Applications open on <b>Monday 9<sup>th</sup> September</b> – Pupils 'sign up' to the online application system using the link given in their Parent/Carer letter ( <a href="https://outreach.shef.ac.uk/">https://outreach.shef.ac.uk/</a> ) and complete the <b>Student Application Form</b> (see page 3) with the help of a parent/teacher.
Oct 2019	Programme Contact signs in to the online application system to review the pupil application and completes the <b>School Supporting Statement</b> form (see page 4).
	All completed applications (comprising both Student Application Form and School Supporting Statement) must be on the system <b>by Friday 18<sup>th</sup> October</b> .
	Completed applications are reviewed by the Outreach team.
Nov 2019	All applicants, parents/carers and schools are informed of the outcome of applications by mid-November.

## Who can participate in Discover US?

It is important for us to demonstrate that we are supporting young people who will benefit most from our activities. This is one of the conditions of the programme funding, under the University's Access and Participation Plan.

### PLEASE NOTE:

Students **CANNOT** be part of both **Discover US** and **US in Schools Mentoring** (if this is a programme your school participates in) and will need to meet the academic criteria and WP Criteria detailed below.

1. **Academic Criteria** - In targeting pupils in your school for Discover US you should ensure they demonstrate the potential to enter both Higher Education and the University of Sheffield. We therefore ask that you only select pupils who have the **academic potential** to achieve the following, or higher:

- Be on track to achieve a minimum of 5 GCSE's grade 9-6, plus English at 4, if not already included

### WP Criteria –

Essential:

- Attend a state school
- Are the first generation of their family to enter Higher Education (it is acceptable to have siblings who have already progressed to HE, or parents who attended HE as a mature student)

Then priority will be given to:

- Students from areas of Low Participation in Higher Education
- Looked After Child / Young Adult Carers
- Students with a declared a disability
- Students from ethnic/gender/socio-economic groups which are currently under-represented within HE\*

*Each application will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Any exceptional circumstances stated by the student and/or the school, such as family upheaval or disrupted schooling, will provide additional context to applications.*

\* As part of these criteria, the University may use a postcode analysis tool to assess levels of deprivation and HE participation based on home postcode. e.g. Indices of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) and Participation of Local Areas (POLAR), which measures the progression rates to higher education from specified postcode areas. You may find it helpful when targeting students to check if their postcode falls within quintile 1 for the POLAR4 and POLAR3 young participation measure, by entering their postcode into the following online tool:

## Completing the Student Application Form

From Monday 9<sup>th</sup> September, your selected pupils will be able to 'Sign Up' to the online application system using the link given in their Parent/Carer letter: <https://outreach.shef.ac.uk/>

To do this, they will need to enter their full name, email address, school name, and date of birth. They will also need to choose a password that they can remember. An email like the one below will be sent to their email address from [heat@sheffield.ac.uk](mailto:heat@sheffield.ac.uk)

When they click on [Confirm your email address](#), it will take them to the online application system 'Student Sign In' page. They need to sign in with their email address and password. It will then continue onto 'My Application', where they can start their application to Discover US.

The 'Student Application' should be completed by the student who is applying, together with either a parent/carer or teacher. Whilst completing the application, students can see helpful notes by using the  icon at the side of questions.

Students will need the following information to complete the application:

- Parent/carer history of attending higher education (if students live with their parents)
- Parent/carer contact details
- Parent/carer current or most recent job title
- Contact details for two emergency contacts (these can be parent/carers if appropriate)

It is possible to save the application after each section in case they do not have the information required immediately available. They can then complete the application at a later stage, before submitting it.

### **Important information about the student application form:**

The student application comprises of the following sections:

**Eligibility:** We ask questions about a students' family attendance at university and questions about citizenship as these are pre-requisites for some of our programmes.

**Personal Details:** These are used when assessing eligibility for our programmes; contact details are also required for future programme correspondence.

**Your Future:** The questions in this section give us an idea of a student's intention towards further study.

**Personal Statements:** This is where a student can tell us more about themselves and why they would like to be on the programme.

**Emergency Contacts:** We collect emergency contact information at this stage in case they are successful in their application to the programme.

**Medical Details:** This is where a student can detail any conditions requiring medical treatment, allergies or other requirements.

**Code of Conduct:** This section outlines our expectations of students on our programmes and asks that they agree to a Code of Conduct.

**Consent:** This section allows participants to choose how we use their data.


**Summary:** This section allows them to review and edit their application one last time before they submit it.

When a pupil submits their application, they will receive a confirmation email, and the application will then appear in the school Programme Contact's 'Submitted Applications' section of the outreach online system.

## Completing the School Supporting Statement


Before submission to the University Outreach team, the assigned 'Programme Contact' for the school needs to review applications and provide supporting information for each student.

To do this, the assigned Programme Contact should sign into the online application system.

## What happens next?


Once the School Supporting Statement has been submitted by the Programme Contact, each student's application will be reviewed by the Outreach team to determine whether they can be accepted onto the programme.

Please note that an application for Discover US does not necessarily guarantee a place on the programme. We aim to inform all applicants, parents/carers and schools of the outcome of applications by mid-November.

### Current Students tab



### Events tab


You are able to see future and past events that pupils from your school have attended. It also allows you to see who has responded to their invitation via outreach online and who is still pending so you are able to follow this up with pupils from your school. As with the above current students tab, you will only view these tabs and information if you are an Application AND Events Contact or an Events Contact only.
