Teaching & Supervision Experience

I am a sociologist with an interest in processes of change, both at the individual level, and the societal level. At the individual level I have explored how people recover from spoilt identities (in this case, a criminal conviction or series of convictions) over a 15 year period. I have more recently explored processes of political, social and economic change at the national level, using the government led by Margaret Thatcher as an example of how ideological changes produce more tangible changes in 'real lives' many years later.

For two years I held a position as a tutor for St. Catherine's College, Oxford. Subsequently I have taught research methods to postgraduate students at Keele, Oxford and Sheffield Universities. Whilst at Keele, I was the Course Director for the M. Res. in Social Science. In September 2007 I took up a post of Reader in Criminology in the Law School at Sheffield University, lecturing to both undergraduate and postgraduate students. I was programme Director for BA Social Policy & Criminology (co-taught with the Department of Sociological Studies). I was promoted to a personal Chair in January 2010. Most recently I have been involved in the production and running of a MOOC on crime and
