**Please read the following prior to applying for a place on the 2018 Series, and discuss with your supervisors and managers as appropriate.**

### **A note about attendance**

The programme is designed in such a way that the learning objectives will only be covered by attendance at all four days and by submission of a portfolio of assignments.

### **A note about peer supervision and your own supervision**

For several years now we have included attendance at peer supervision groups as part of the workshop series. Some time is spent in these groups within the workshop time, but the groups are required to meet four times outside of the workshops (times and venues are negotiated by the groups). Wherever possible these are organised by specialty and locality to minimise inconvenience. You must also arrange to have supervision on your supervision – this could be within or separate to your clinical supervision.

### **A note about assignments**

At the end of the series we require the submission of a portfolio of work to complete the training process. We provide formative feedback on this. You will need time in between the workshops to complete the assignments (e.g. Reflections on Supervisory Practice (3x500 words), Goal Attainment Scales, Feedback from Supervisees, Feedback from Supervisors, Problem Based Learning Exercises). You will also be expected to gain supervisory feedback on your own supervision practice.

### **A note about providing supervision during the ISW**

It is not possible to complete all the required assignments unless participants can take on some significant supervisory responsibilities during the course of the training programme. By preference they should be able to contribute to the supervision of a trainee clinical psychologist during this period but alternatively supervising an assistant psychologist or member of an allied health profession would be pertinent and valuable experience.

### **A note on the allocation of places**

Due to the residential nature of the first two days, numbers will be limited. We will confirm whether you have a place on the course by the end of January 2018. Places will be offered on a **first come, first served** basis with each university having an allocated number of places. Priority will be given to those who graduated in **2016 or before**. Places are allocated to those providing, or are about to provide, placements. If you do not fulfil these criteria please email the appropriate Programme contact. In some specific cases a fee for attendance for the ISW training can be charged. When your place is confirmed, we will send you a course pack and hotel information.
