Current Awareness

1. **Beta blockers 'may stop breast cancer spreading'**

Cancer experts are to carry out a major study to see if commonly used blood pressure drugs cut the risk of breast cancer spreading. Data from 800 patients has already shown those previously given beta blockers had half the chance of their cancer spreading as women who had not. <http://www.bbc.co.uk/news/health-15117324>

2. **Cigarette vending machines banned in England**

The sale of tobacco from vending machines has been banned in England, with anyone caught selling cigarettes in machines facing a fine of £2,500. The Department of Health said the ban had been introduced to prevent under-age sales to children and to support adults who were trying to quit. 3. **New non-emergency health phone number to launch**

A non-emergency telephone number for NHS services is to launch across England, the Department of Health says. The 111 number, which has been tested in four areas, will be available nationally by April 2013. The service will replace NHS Direct, which the government announced it was scrapping last year. It will give health advice and information about services such as out-of-hours GPs, walk-in centres, emergency dentists and pharmacies. <http://www.bbc.co.uk/news/uk-15138597>

4. **Students' mental health 'at risk', psychiatrists warn**

Doctors are warning that the current generation of students has a greater risk of anxiety and depression than previous ones. The Royal College of Psychiatrists says there are now many more students from less privileged backgrounds who are less

prepared for university life. Students also face rising debt and uncertain job prospects, it warns. It is concerned universities may see counselling and support services as an easy target for cuts. <http://www.bbc.co.uk/news/health-15112980>

5. Fake medicine trade: UK crackdown on drug importers

Investigators are cracking down on the multi-million pound trade in fake and unlicensed medicines, as concerns grow over potential health risks. BBC News joined investigators on one of their raids. More people are diagnosing their medical problems and buying medicines online - boosting the growing trade in fake and illegitimate drugs supplied without a prescription. Enforcement agencies warned that those taking the drugs are risking their health, as they launched an international operation to tackle the problem. The Medicines and Healthcare products Regulation Agency (MHRA) says more than a million doses of medicines worth approximately £2m have been seized from the UK's postal service and ports during its latest crackdown. <http://www.bbc.co.uk/news/uk-15095056>
